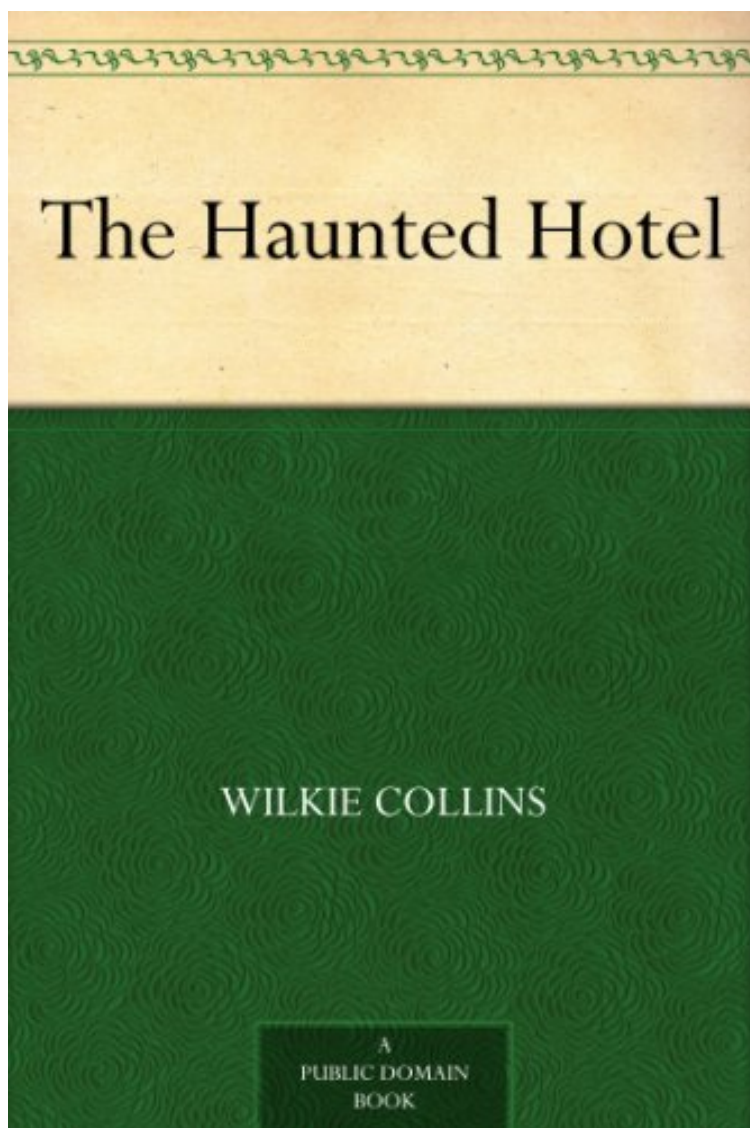

playwright and short story writer best-known for *The Woman in White* (1859), *No Name* (1862), *Armadale* (1866) and *The Moonstone* (1868). He was born into the London family of painter William Collins and lived in Italy and France as a child learning French and Italian. After his first novel, *Antonina*, was published in 1850 he met Charles Dickens, who became a close friend, collaborator and mentor. Some of his work was first published in *All the Year Round* and *Household Words*, run by Dickens, and the two collaborated on drama and fiction.
